


Picture Hint Cards

Misconception (53)- A wrong belief that is based on false facts, or incomplete facts.

“One of humankind’s most enduring misconceptions is that of nature’s bounty.”

Indestructible (53)- Not able to be destroyed.


*“Fish in particular were thought to be especially **indestructible**.”*

Darwinism (53)- those that supported the ideas of Charles Darwin.

*“Even those who believe in **Darwinism** believe that nature is such a complex force, there is little humans can do to interfere with it.”*

Posthumously (54)- work published or shared after the original author has died.

“And celebrated French novelist Alexandre Dumas wrote in his spectacularly incorrect food encyclopedia, Le Grand Dictionnaire de Cuisine, published posthumously: It has been calculated that if no accident prevented the hatching of the eggs and each egg reached maturity, it would only take three years to fill the sea so that you could walk across the Atlantic dryshod on the backs of cod.”

Refuted (55)- to prove something wrong.

Promoting (56)- to push the progress further, or for a person to get a higher job title or salary.



Objecting (58)- disagree with something

*“In other words, by **objecting** to what they saw as destructive practices, they were trying to interfere with the progress of technology.”*

Industrial Revolution (58)- a time period (18th and 19th century) where our society moved from a mainly farming based society, to a society focused mainly on machinery work.

*“Just as computers and cyberelectronics have changed everything we do today, industry and mechanical inventions were changed the way everything was done in the 19th century, an age that became known as the **Industrial Revolution**.”*

Diminution (58)- tiny.

*“Speaking at the 1883 International Fisheries Exhibitions in London, which was attended by representatives of the leading fishing nations of the world, Huxley gave a speech in which he said, “Any tendency to over-fishing will meet with its natural check in the **diminution** of the supply....In other words, we will realize we were overfishing by the simple fact that we were hauling in fewer fish.””*

Exhaustion (59)- worn out, very tired.

*“He further assured everyone that “this check will always come into operation long before anything like permanent **exhaustion** has occurred.”*

Scarce (59) -not very much.

*“If fisherman caused a decline in the population of fish, they could no longer fish that species because it would be to **scarce**, and that would allow the species to recover.”*
