This list contains words that are used most frequently in academic settings. These words should be strategically infused into the school culture and classroom settings. Effective vocabulary instruction includes:

- Encountering a target word in semantically rich contexts within motivating texts, rather than in a list of words
- Repeated exposure to the word, in varied contexts
- Opportunities to use the word orally and in writing
- Explicit instruction in the word's meaning
- Explicit instruction in word learning strategies, including analysis of the word's parts and its multiple subject-specific meanings

Suggestions for including these academic words in your efforts to advance literacy include:

- Encouraging PLTs and/or teaching teams to plan how to effectively deliver instruction relating to these words.
- Sharing these words systematically through school announcements, website resources, school-wide publicity, etc.
- Devising a strategic plan for each content area to use specific words (for example, on Mondays, ELA classes add the word to the vocabulary notebook; on Tuesdays, science classes find the word in context and record their findings; on Wednesday, social studies classes use the word with a literacy strategy like Verbal-visual Association or Frayer Model; etc.)
- Creating public way for students to read and learn about these words during non-academic times such as waiting in the lunch line, looking in bathroom mirrors, walking on sidewalks (via chalk), etc.
